


## MEET YOUR INSTRUCTOR Karen Hammond



A successful writer and editor herself, Karen Hammond has helped many others achieve their goal of publication in both fiction and nonfiction. For a period of about nine years she was a member of the adjunct faculty at Binghamton University where she taught popular courses in freelance magazine writing and creative nonfiction. She has also been an instructor with the Institute for Writers (formerly Long Ridge Writers Group) for more than two decades.

Karen takes special pride in helping students achieve clarity and liveliness in their writing, something she always strives for in her own work.
